PLANT PROTECTION PRODUCTS REGULATIONS 2005 (NORTHERN IRELAND)**

(All references to this legislation in this Notice of extension of approved use and in any annexes to it are to the same as amended to the date of issue of this notice).

This extension of the approved use provides for the use of the product named below in respect of crops and situations, other than those included on the product label. Such an 'an extension of use', is at all times done at the user's choosing, and the commercial risk is entirely theirs.

The conditions below are obligatory. They must be complied with when the extension of use occurs. Failure to abide by the conditions of approval may constitute a breach of that approval, and a contravention of the Plant Protection Products Regulations 2005. For the purposes of this extension of use only, the conditions and/or requirements shown below supersede any corresponding conditions and/or requirements set out on the label or otherwise provided for under the main approval which would otherwise apply.

Operator Protection:

- (1) Engineering control of operator exposure must be used where reasonably practicable in addition to the following personal protective equipment:

Operators must wear suitable protective clothing (coveralls), suitable protective gloves and face protection (faceshield) when handling the concentrate.

- (2) However, engineering controls may replace personal protective equipment if a COSHH assessment shows that they provide an equal or higher standard of protection.

Environmental protection:

- (1) Since there is a risk to aquatic life from use, direct spray from horizontal boom sprayers must not be allowed to fall within 5m of the top of the bank of any static or flowing waterbody or within 1m of the top of a ditch which is dry at the time of application. Spray must be aimed away from water.


Buffer zones must be measured in accordance with the guidance set out in the booklet 'Local Environment Risk assessment for Pesticides - Horizontal Boom Sprayers' available from HSE Chemicals Regulation Directorate's website and any amendments made to it.

- (2) To protect non-target insects/arthropods respect an untreated buffer zone of 5m to non crop land.

Other specific restrictions:

- (1) This product must only be applied in accordance with the terms of this authorisation, the product label and/or leaflet and any additional guidance on extensions of authorisation.

- (2) A maximum number of 4 applications per crop must not be exceeded.
- (3) A minimum interval of 7 days must be observed between applications

ADVISORY INFORMATION

This Extension of Authorisation relates to the use of 'Markate 50' (M13529) for use as an insecticide for the control of beet leaf miner, cutworm and flea beetle on fodder beet. Product to be applied by conventional hydraulic sprayer in a minimum water volume of 200 litres/ha. For control of cutworm, a minimum water volume of 400 litres/ha should be used.

When applying using tractor mounted boom sprayers avoid spraying within 5 m of the field boundary to reduce effects on non-target insects or other arthropods

This authorisation has been re-issued to amend the expiry date in line with the parent authorisation
